

Lewandowski, Adam Frank

Went home to be with his Lord on Monday, June 27, 2016 at RidgeCrest Health Center. Adam was born on April 2, 1918, in Jackson, MI, to Mary (Kruepesta) and Frank Lewandowski. He was preceded in death by his parents, three sisters, and one grandchild. Adam married Evelyn Schwer on July 3, and next week would have been their 69th anniversary. Also surviving are his daughter Linda (Robert) Moorehead, and sons Philip (Karen) Lewan and Michael (Linda) Lewandowski. Adam was grandfather to nine, great-grandfather to twenty, and great-great grandfather to two. During 1935, Adam served with the Civilian Conservation Corps for a year. Many trees around the Grayling area were planted by his unit. Adam entered the Army December of 1942, serving during WW II, and was honorably discharged in October of 1945. He was sent to Normandy on D-Day, and participated in the second wave that brought in munitions for the invasion. He served in the motor pool, and was awarded the Good Conduct Medal, World War II Victory Medal, American Campaign Medal, and the European African Middle Eastern Campaign Medal with five bronze stars. After the war, he worked at Sparks Withington, Sparton Electronics, and with his sons established Lampco Manufacturing in 1969, where he worked until his retirement. At home, Adam was a wonderful husband, father, grandfather, and a master gardener, planting gardens a half-acre in size with no weeds allowed. He spent many hours with his grandchildren, teaching them many practical skills. His biggest and best accomplishment was his total devotion to his Savior. He was a member of the Jackson Free Methodist Church, and the Spring Arbor Free Methodist Church. He served as head usher for many years, and also served as a Sunday School teacher. He never forgot a name, always wore a cheerful smile, and gave out a lot of hugs and blessings. The family would like to thank RidgeCrest Health Center for their wonderful care of Adam. He was blessed to have such dear friends there, both staff and residents. Thank you, also, to Great Lakes Caring Hospice taking such tender care of Adam, keeping him comfortable and content.
